TERMS OF BUSINESS FOR EXPERT WITNESS WORK

1. General:

The following terms and conditions shall apply to the provision of medico-legal reports and dental expert witness work by David Reaney.

2. Professional Indemnity:

Full professional indemnity is held with Dental Protection Limited, which includes all aspects of my dental work and medico-legal activities.

It shall be the duty of the Instructing Solicitors, so far as possible, to provide me with adequate instructions.

3. Charges:

3.1 Average fees as at November 2016 are £450 for a screening report and £750.00 for a standard Court Report provided from inspection of records only.

3.2 Average fees as at November 2016 are £900.00 for a standard Court Report provided from inspection of records and Examination of Patient.

There will be higher charges for more complex cases.

Additional charges will apply for telephone advice or additional/subsequent Reports or extensions to Reports at £150.00 per hour.

The hourly rate for travel is £150.00, together with the costs of First Class Rail or Air travel.

Attendance at Court is £1,200.00 per day or £750.00 per half day.

3.3 I may increase my charges to Instructing Solicitors by 50 percent for any work outside the United Kingdom and Ireland.

3.4 Where I make myself available to give evidence in court and, subsequently, due to an out-of-court settlement or for any other reason, am no longer required to appear, I shall be entitled to charge a minimum of 50 per cent of the original fee agreed for appearing in court (the 'original fee' meaning the agreed daily rate multiplied by the number of days at court for which I make myself available).

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3.5 If Instructing Solicitors give me at least 6 day's notice of cancellation, I shall waive the charge in 3.4 above. It shall be the Instructing Solicitor's sole responsibility to ensure that such notice is given on time.

3.6 The amount due to me shall not be subject to taxation. It shall be the sole responsibility of Instructing Solicitors in Legal Aid cases, to obtain prior approval of my charges from the Legal Aid Board.

4 Payment:

Instructing Solicitors shall pay all sums due within thirty days of the date of invoice. For Instructing Solicitors who are late in payment, interest at three per cent per annum above the base rate will automatically be added to the sum due. I reserve the right at all times to require advance payment for the written report(s) prior to supplying them to Instructing Solicitors.

5 Record Keeping:

A record is kept on each case indicating the work done on behalf of the Instructing Solicitor and I am happy to supply a copy of this to the Instructing Solicitor on request. Records of reports are kept for 5 years. All client(s)' records are regarded as confidential and will not be revealed to third parties without the written permission of the Instructing Solicitor.

6 Confidential Information:

Instructing Solicitors shall treat all information supplied by myself as confidential and shall use such information for the purposes of the litigation to which my evidence relates. Instructing Solicitors shall not disclose such information, directly or indirectly, to any third party other than as required for the above mentioned purposes, without my prior consent.
